Student Paper Competition

The IEEE student paper competition offers undergraduate student members the opportunity to exercise and improve both written and verbal communication skills. Engineers will be constantly called upon to communicate ideas to others throughout their careers. Researching, writing, and presenting a paper provides students with invaluable early experience in expressing ideas related to engineering. IEEE Tucson section awards first, second, and third place prizes to the best original student papers.

FIRST PRIZE: \$300 SECOND PRIZE: \$150 THIRD PRIZE: \$75

Submissions consist of two parts: a type-written paper on any engineering subject (due MARCH 22nd, 2008) and an oral presentation of that paper on March 29th, 2008. The written paper must be type-written, double-spaced, 12-point font, and no longer than 15 pages maximum. It must also meet the IEEE student paper guidelines outlined

(at the website below). You can also get a copy of the guidelines by requesting them from Brenda Huettner (bphuettner@ieee.org).

Papers must be submitted in either PDF or Microsoft Word format, and be submitted by email to bphuettner@ieee.org no later than March 22nd, 2008.

All oral presentations will be 15 minutes long plus a 5-minute question and answer period, and must be presented in person on March 29th, 2008. A computer will be provided for the contestants to use, since PowerPoint slides are the recommended approach.

The paper that wins first place in the local competition will automatically be submitted to the Southwest Area competition, which offers additional cash prizes. The winning entrant must be available to present their paper at that event here in Tucson, on April 12th, 2008.
